

Hypertrophic cardiomyopathy (HCM) is the most common inherited monogenic cardiac disorder, affecting 0.2-0.5% of the population.^[1,2] In the United States, 750,000 people are estimated to have HCM; however, only approximately 100,000 people have been diagnosed, signifying a large gap in the recognition and understanding of this disease.

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As diagnostic and therapeutic paradigms for HCM continue to evolve, cardiovascular clinicians will need to become familiar with the diagnosis of this condition.

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
